The Montgomery Election Center is encouraging Montgomery citizens to vote on Tuesday, August 23, 2011 in our Municipal Election. This important citywide election will determine our mayor and city council members.

Citizens living in Montgomery must be a registered

and qualified voter to vote in the Municipal Election. If you have moved or relocated in Montgomery and need to register to vote or update your address, contact the

Absentee voting will begin on Thursday, July 14, 2011 and voters must complete an Absentee Ballot Application before receiving the ballot. An Absentee Ballot Application can be obtained by calling 832-1281, downloading the application from www.montgomeryelectioncenter.org, or by visiting

the Montgomery Election Center downtown at 125 Washington Avenue.

The following deadlines assure the election process runs smoothly for voters, candidates, and polling officials:

- Last day to register to vote is Friday, August 12
 - Last day to apply for an Absentee Ballot is Thursday, August 18
 - Hand-delivery deadline for an Absentee Ballot is Monday, August 22
- Postmark deadline for an Absentee Ballot is Monday, August 22 and must be received at The Election Center by noon on Tuesday, August 23
- Election Day is Tuesday, August 23 from 7:00 a.m.
 7 p.m. at the voter's designated polling place.

Dial **241-2651** to report non-emergency incidents.

A non-emergency call is simply a request for police service that is not a life or death situation such as:

- Cars blocking the street or driveway
- Abandoned vehicle
- Vehicle collision in a parking lot
- Non-injury collision not blocking the street
- Loud party
- Barking dog
- Crimes not in progress such as vandalism, or property thefts.
- Other events not requiring an emergency response.

Once upon a time the Capitol Grill was the place to go on Saturday morning to meet your neighbors, sip coffee, savor omelets and grits, and trade gossip. Since it closed several months ago some folks have been searching for a place to fill that Saturday breakfast niche.

Well, search no more. The Latino Supermarket at 1550 Mt Meigs Road serves up a fresh and delicious breakfast every day. You won't find grits and country ham here but you will find excellent food. There is no breakfast menu yet so this is what I recommend: ask for huevos rancheros (the best I've ever had) or plantains or Mexican eggs (eggs scrambled with onions and peppers). Or you can order from the lunch menu. While you wait for your food you can watch the cook in the kitchen making tortillas for your meal. If you've never had a fresh tortilla, you are in for a treat!

It's a great place for lunch and dinner too. While you're there, shop in the market for items you can't find anywhere else. The coconut popsicles are a perfect finish to a great meal.
