Discover Montgomery with a walking tour of Oakwood Cemetery's Eastern Annex. Learn how sentiments and understanding about death have changed over the years. Jeff Benton, local historian and author, leads the tour from the Royal Air Force and Free French World War II cemeteries to Hank Williams' grave, Eternal Rest Cemetery, Union Civil War Memorial and St. Margaret's Cemetery – and places of interest along the route.

Learn about the changing architectural styles of marking graves with Celtic crosses, urns, columns, obelisks and more.

& Tour participants are asked to meet at the Hank Williams Memorial in Oakwood Cemetery's Eastern Annex: it's marked from Lower Wetumpka Road. Wear comfortable shoes. Sunday morning, the annual British and French Memorial Remembrance Sunday ceremony precedes the 1:30 walking tour at 10:30 a.m. **November 11** is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the armistice that ended World War I.

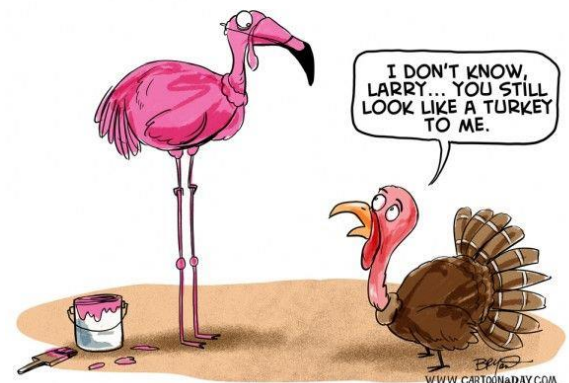
