Cat Program

— a trap, neuter, release initiative — is underway in Montgomery and Montgomery County. Its goal is to maintain the population level of feral cats in the area.


Katie Pinson, our neighbor writes, "Since our neighborhood has such a problem with feral cats I thought it may be worth mentioning the Montgomery Humane Shelter's new intervention program. Since I have gotten so passionate about TNR, I have found that many people are reluctant to spay/neuter feral cats because they don't want to be responsible for the cost of the surgery. This new program from the shelter is free. I have personally benefited from this program with the feral cats that I take care of. How the program works is that you trap the cat in either a humane trap (which can be borrowed free of charge from MHS) or a pet carrier. Then you will bring the cat to the intake facility at MHS Sunday-Saturday anytime between 10-5pm. You do not need to make an appointment. You will tell the intake technician that the cat is feral and you want to get it fixed under their community cat program. While under their care the cat will receive the spay/neuter surgery, have their ear tipped, and receive a rabies shot. When the cat is ready to be picked up they will call you. Then you will release the cat wherever you found it. Currently there is not information about this free

program on their website but if you call MHS at (334)409-0622 or go to the Intervention page on



Facebook you will see more information.
